Protect yourself fromHoliday Scams

- Between Black Friday and the hustle and bustle of Christmas shopping it can get hectic and your guard could be down. Here are a few scams to be aware of to protect you during this holiday season.
 - 1. Gift Exchange Scams. Did you get a holiday Secret Santa post on Facebook? This scam offers the "secret sister" gift exchange, promises up to 36 gifts in exchange. The Better Business Bureau warns that this innocent gift swap is a pyramid scheme. This digital chain letter is considered illegal gambling and not to mention gives the scammers your home address.
 - 2. Phony Shipping Notifications. You may receive an email that looks as if it's from UPS or FedEx and can look very legitimate. The email will say that your shipment is on its way and arrangements need to be made for delivery. However, when you click on the link to update shipping preferences you have opened up malware that tracks your computer activity so personal information can be compromised; like credit card numbers and other personal information.
 - 3. Porch Pirates. This is exactly like it sounds. When packages are left on your porch or in an accessible mailbox you are vulnerable to someone helping themselves to your holiday deliveries. To protect yourself consider requiring a signature for delivery or have your package delivered to your work address.
 - 4. Charitable giving. Giving back during the holidays is wonderful but it can make easy pickings for scammers. Be on the lookout for fraudulent charities. A few red flags are charity names that sound close to established charities, aggressive pitches, and requests through email or even at your door step. If you are looking to give to a charity you need to be the one to reach out to the charity of your choosing.
