### **Red Flags**

Ways to spot a phone scam



- 1 Receive a call at an odd hour
- 2 Caller speaks with urgency for you to make a decision
- 3 Caller asks you to share a one-time passcode or pin
- Caller asks for personal information, such as full card number, account number, passwords, etc.
- 5 Caller asks you to give remote access to your device

STAY ALERT AND INFORMED TO SPOT AND AVOID SCAMS!

#### **Best Practices**

Ways to avoid a phone scam

- Don't rely on caller ID, scammers can spoof calls to make it look legitimate
- 2 Don't share your account details, card numbers, or other personal information
- Verify caller's identity, hang up, and call us directly at (808)933-6700






# **BEWARE OF TEXT SCAMS**

### **Red Flags**

Ways to spot a scam text



- Caller ID shows a regular phone number instead of a short text code (Example: 49447)
- Name not listed correctly
- 3 Does not reference the last four digits of the card
- Required "FreeMsg" not displayed in text
- 5 Required option to "STOP" to end not displayed in text

### **Best Practices**

Ways to avoid a scam text

- 1) Sign up for our cards app to review transactions
- 2 Setup Transaction alerts to review purchases in real-time
- 3 Contact the credit union directly to avoid scammers
- 4 Call the number on the back of your card if you have questions
