Welcome out new board member Ka'iu Kimura

Ka'iu Kimura is the Executive Director of the 'Imiloa Astronomy Center of Hawai'i and the Director of Ka Haka 'Ula O Ke'elikōlani College of Hawaiian Language at the University of Hawai'i at Hilo. A dedicated advocate for Hawaiian language and culture, she has played a pivotal role in integrating Indigenous knowledge with scientific research while fostering community engagement.

Ka'iu, a graduate of Kamehameha Schools, earned her BA and MA in Hawaiian Language and Literature from UH Hilo and is currently a PhD candidate in the university's Indigenous Language Revitalization program. Her passion for language revitalization was inspired by her uncle, Larry Kimura, a founding board member of Pūnana Leo and a key figure in the Hawaiian language movement. Witnessing the success of Hawaiian-speaking families, she was motivated to dedicate her career to ensuring the perpetuation of 'Ōlelo Hawai'i.

Before her leadership at 'Imiloa and Ka Haka 'Ula, Ka'iu worked with 'Aha Pūnana Leo, developing outreach programs for Native Hawaiian and international Indigenous communities. She has also lectured at UH Hilo, created Hawaiian language curricula for various industries, and participated in prestigious fellowships, including the First Nations' Futures Fellowship and the Omidyar Fellows program.

Kaʻiu continues to lead efforts in education, culture, and science, strengthening the bridge between traditional knowledge and contemporary innovation for the benefit of future generations. We are excited to welcome Kaʻiu Kimura to our team and create "More Possibilities" for the people we serve.

SPOT & AVOID SCAMS

At CU Hawai'i, we care about your financial safety and we want you to be aware of these types of scams and how to prevent them. Whenever you are in doubt, please contact us directly at (808)933-6700.



Ways to spot & avoid Phone Scams

- Receive a call at an odd hour
- 2 Caller speaks with urgency for you to make a decision
- 3 Caller asks you to share a one-time passcode or pin
- Caller asks for personal information, such as full card number, account number, passwords, etc.
- 5 Caller asks you to give remote access to your device
 - Don't rely on caller ID, scammers can spoof calls to make it look legitimate
- Don't share your account details, card numbers, or other personal information

Verify caller's identity, hang up, and call us directly at (808)933-6700



Ways to spot & avoid Text Scams

- Caller ID shows a regular phone number instead of a short text code (Example: 49447)
- 2 Name not listed correctly
- 3 Does not reference the last four digits of the card
- Required "FreeMsg" not displayed in text
- 6 Required option to "STOP" to end not displayed in text
- Sign up for our cards app to review transactions
- Setup Transaction alerts to review purchases in real-time
- Contact the credit union directly to avoid scammers
- Call the number on the back of your card if you have questions







